Overview

Each school's Progress Report (1) measures student year-to-year progress, (2) compares the school to peer schools and (3) rewards success in moving all children forward, especially children with the greatest needs. Strong Progress Report results are the basis for monetary rewards for school leaders, and poor results are an important factor in determining whether schools require intensive support or intervention. 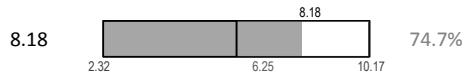

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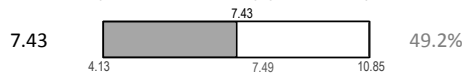
Credit Accumulation

Avg. credits earned per year, starting year with 0.00 - 22.00 Credits (n=18)



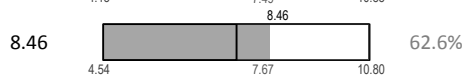

Avg. credits earned per year, starting year with 22.01 - 33.00 Credits (n=94)



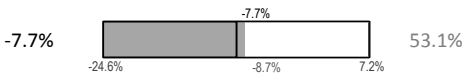

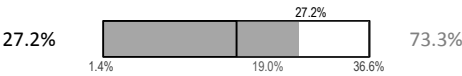

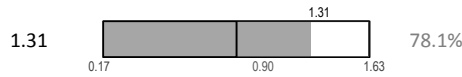
Average Completion Rate for Remaining Regents (n=203)

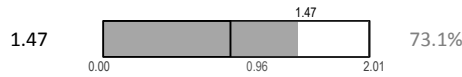
Weighted Regents Pass Rate

Schools receive additional credit for exceptional gains by students with disabilities, English Language Learners, and students with the lowest 8th grade proficiency citywide. A school earns full additional credit when its results are in the top 20% of schools citywide. It earns half credit when its results are in the top 40%. Additional Credit can only improve a school's Progress Report score. It cannot lower a school's score. YABCs are eligible for points on 7 additional credit metrics, each of which is worth up to 2 points. In the table below, "." in "This School's Results" indicates that a school has fewer than 10 eligible students in one of the weighted diploma rate categories or fewer than 15 eligible students in one of the other categories.

High schools build the foundation of skills and knowledge students need to achieve postsecondary success. As we move toward the Common Core State Standards and the goal of ensuring that our students not only graduate from high school, but graduate ready for the demands of college or the workforce, the Progress Report is evolving to reward high schools whose students successfully engage in rigorous coursework, graduate having met the standards necessary to begin taking college courses for credit, and go on to enroll in college after graduation.

Three new college readiness measures are reported below as unscored metrics, and will be integrated into schools' Progress Report scores and grades beginning with the 2011-12 Progress Report. The peer averages represent school-level averages for YABC programs, and are provided for context.

College Readiness Index

This metric measures the percentage of students in the 2011 six year cohort (all students who entered high school six years earlier) who graduated and met the Regents exam, SAT, and/or course standards for passing out of remedial coursework at the City University of New York (CUNY), by August 2011.

College Enrollment Rate

This metric measures the percentage of students in the 2010 six year cohort (all students who entered high school six years earlier) who graduated and enrolled in a degree program at a two- or four-year college or university by December 31, 2010.
